Defibrillator Report to Priston Parish Council for 25th January 2016.

Maintenance records are up to date with no known problems.

I can now report that the new defibrillator cabinet has been sited where the original was on the north-west corner of the Village Hall. It is now fully operational. There is no need for the external light, which illuminated the previous cabinet, to remain as the new cabinet has a green light that switches on during the dark hours and the key pad has its own light. However at the moment it contains the original defibrillator which will remain there until familiarisation training has been given.

All households in the village have been notified of the access code for the new cabinet.

Clive Setter of AED Locator (the company we bought the equipment from) has offered us a one off course. The dates he has offered are Tuesday, Wednesday or Wednesday, 2nd, 3rd or 4th of February. I have offered the course to all trained villagers with a current certificate. I will ask Setter to come on the day most people are willing to attend.

I am looking to arrange a refresher course for those whose certificate expires this year.
