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## **Roads and Highways Report to Priston Parish Council meeting of 7<sup>th</sup> September 2015**

1. We are finalising the work to be done on the Farmborough road but I will up-date as I have it.
2. The 20 mph signs at the top turning are still in place after some considerable time after BANES agreed to remove them.
3. Parcel 5856 traffic ie cars, vans, lorries are travelling faster than the speed limit which needs to be addressed.
4. Parishioners leaving their cars on side of the road to help slow the traffic may be causing more of a hindrance than a help as it forces traffic to the other side of the road and after one case of narrowly missing a child on its bike it might be time for a re-think.
4. After the hard work of a few people in the village all for the greater good, our small green/ triangle which was looking tidy, has been trashed on a number of occasions by the cement lorries, this needs to be repaired and not left to look an eye sore.
